



Dear Parent,

Welcome to Bowlers Community Nursery! We're thrilled that you've chosen Bowlers for your child and look forward to welcoming you to the Bowlers community in person soon.

At Bowlers, we believe that every young child has in common the need for plenty of love, care and a familiar routine, which incorporates their individual needs and interests. We operate a Key Person system so that children can forge strong and loving relationships with their key staff member, helping them feel secure away from home. But our team recognises that parents are the primary carers and educators and works closely with parents to learn about their child and life at home.

Our activities are based around the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum, but more importantly they have a child centred approach, the emphasis being on learning through play.

Bowlers is proud to be a very special and community-orientated nursery. Our care for your child is at the heart of everything we do, and we extend this support to the whole family. One of the reasons parents choose Bowlers and stay with us is because we encourage parents to be a part of their child's nursery environment, helping with play, learning, and to make Bowlers a wonderful place for children.

Parental involvement at Bowlers – opportunities and expectations

Bowlers is run by the Senior Management Team of Yolande Farrell (Manager) and Aoife Morgan (Deputy Manager). Yolande, Aoife and also Chris Aihoon, our accountant, are supported and guided by Directors, most of whom also Chair the voluntary Committees (all run by parents of Bowlers children). As a parent at Bowlers, you are automatically on the Management Committee, which forms part of Bowlers oversight. Management Committee meetings take place three times a year. They occur once each term, two are in the evening after nursery and the third is an AGM on a Saturday morning in July. At least one parent from every two-parent family is expected to attend these meetings. Yolande will let you know when they're scheduled, via the monthly email newsletter, and a crèche is provided.

Bowlers is a community nursery in every sense of the word 'community'. The Social and Fundraising Committee organises regular Sunday lunches to enable families to get to know one another better, as well as other social events like picnics, Christmas drinks and the Summer post-AGM BBQ. Details are provided in the monthly newsletters, through emails, and on the nursery's Facebook page, a closed group which parents are invited to join ([facebook.com/groups/bowlersnursery/](https://www.facebook.com/groups/bowlersnursery/)).

Bowlers requires parents to contribute to the running of the nursery. There are a number of ways to get involved and keep Bowlers a brilliant nursery and to help us make it an even better caring environment for your child:

1. Join one of our committees

There are often specific vacancies in particular committees, but you're welcome to join any committee. Don't worry if you don't think you have relevant skills, we all think that at first! Parents learn from each other, and there are some opportunities for free training. This could be a great way to refresh your CV and gain new skills. If you're interested in joining a committee, please contact the committee chair (see appendix for contact details).

2. Run an activity with the children

If you have particular skills (for example, sports, music, acting, art, dance), speak to Yolande or Aoife about arranging to come in to run some activities with the children.

3. Be part of a Bowlers weekend

Several times a year we'll hold a weekend (typically one day) at Bowlers, centred around a specific activity. This might be tidying the garden, building a sandpit, clearing a backlog of maintenance work. We always need bodies for these, and again don't worry if you don't feel skilled: there are plenty of parents who do have skills and can help guide you.

4. Become a Director

We don't expect new parents to become Directors straight away; most parents get involved in Committees first. But if you are keen to become a Director do speak to either of the co-chairs and we'd be happy to discuss opportunities. We vote in new Directors annually at the AGM.

- Staffing:** We are responsible for advising and supporting senior management on HR and staff-related issues. We are looking for anybody with any kind of expertise in this area.
